PLANNING MEETING REPORT BACK - SA MASTERS GAMES (27 APRIL TO 1 MAY 2006)

Recent meetings were held in the Host City with officials from Nelson Mandela Bay Metro Sport and Tourism, and leaders of various sport codes from the Eastern Cape.

1. Venues for all 46 sports, listed for the Games, are available and tentatively booked. Preference has been given to venues which can accommodate a number of codes.
2. Accommodation: Metro Tourism is to supply visitors with a wide choice at best tariffs, including 1 to 5 star hotels, holiday / self-catering apartments and numerous guesthouses.
3. The Eastern Cape is renowned for its ideal venues for water sport. All possible water sports will be accommodated. A heated pool, 25m long at the University, is

available for swimming and water polo.

4. SAMSA, together with Tourism, is investigating special airline options between Johannesburg and Port Elizabeth, for all codes and supporters.
5. A few local coordinators for individual codes have been appointed.

All participating codes are invited to nominate their own local co-coordinator, to be appointed by the Games organizers on the co-ordinators committee. Kindly inform SAMSA asap, of the name and contact details of your nominee.

The South African Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee (SASCOC)
