## SASCOC E-NEWS SEPT 2006:

Integration is not only intended to be vertical, but must also be horizontal i.e. integrating school sport, tertiary sport and sport for the disabled into the national development programmes of National Federations. So the establishment of SASCOC was only the beginning, the creation of a platform for this ultimate ideal and eventuality.

To this extend I can report that with incorporation of SASSU and DISSA, into SASCOC by the end of October, the process envisaged in the MTT report will be accomplished.

Since we have now registered important achievements in our macro-sport consolidation and structural alignment, we must now focus on the critical issue of finding the necessary resources to enable us to achieve our stated developmental goals and objectives.

In this respect I must register our strongest protest for the lack of progress between the Ministry of Sport and Recreation and the Ministry of Trade and Industry who have been contesting the appointment of the National Lottery Sports Distribution Agency since March or April this year without resolution.

To tier up over R400m in undistributed lottery funds in such serious circumstances is with respect to the Ministries totally unacceptable and most regrettable. This situation is placing most National Sports Organizations that depend on this funding in an inordinately perilous position.
