SOCCER:

South Africa's biggest ever International sport event to date!
FIFA WORLD CUP! To be held for the first time on the continent of Africa, South Africa from 11 June to 11 July 2010.

NETBALL:

The biggest women's team sport in the world, is celebrating its 50th anniversary 2010. The 1st International Federation of Netball Associations (IFNA) was formed at an inaugural meeting held in Colombo, Ceylon in August 1960.

Founding members:
Australia, England, Ceylon (Sri Lanka), New Zealand, South Africa and the West Indies.

Since its inception in 1960 the Game has spread to 66 countries and is included in the quadrennial Commonwealth Games, the World Games and the World Masters Games. The next INFA quadrennial World Championships to be held in Singapore, 3-16 July 2011 and the next World Masters Games in Torino, Italy 2013 (awaiting further information)
